The Call for Workshops is your best opportunity to secure a speaking role at the IPF.

Submissions are open now: Aug. 6 - Nov. 10

Why submit?

- Showcase your expertise.
- Expand your network.
- Gain recognition among peers.
- Join the Americas' largest offshore wind and ocean renewables conference.

What's a workshop?

Workshops are typically 60-minute panel discussions, but presentations and creative audience engagement approaches are encouraged.

Workshops should be submitted as comprehensive sessions that:

- Recount real-world projects.
- Advance critical conversations.
- Propose solutions to challenges.
- Introduce emerging topics, technology, or research.
- Present valuable data, trends, or market analysis.

Workshops are scored by the IPF Program Committee using specific criteria. Oceantic Network staff use their reviews to make final selections.

If your workshop is selected, speakers will receive discounted registration and are required to stay in the Network's hotel room block and promote 2025 IPF.

Running out of time?

It's better to submit something than nothing at all. But remember, the more information you provide, the better the IPF Program Committee can review your submission.
